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Music Lessons

Our specialist Music Teacher is teaching the classes about rhythms and beats this term. The children have been composing their own rhythms. By using large and small circles, our Reception and Year 1 pupils explored creating different rhythms and reading them. Year 2 also used Crotchet rests and circles without a note for the silent beats. Year 3 changed the words of the song "A Sailor Went to Sea" and thought of actions to go along with the words - they were all so creative.

Year 5 performed a cyclic piece - layered ostinato patterns during which they sang a song from Nigeria. Well done to all our pupils, we are so proud of their musical achievements and can see how much the children enjoy taking part.









Guitar Lessons

Science Trip to Walpole Park

On Friday 11th October, Year 4 took a short trip over the road to Walpole Park for their Science lesson. The



ip over the road to Walpole Park for their Science lesson. The children have been learning about classifying animals and were there to search for invertebrates.

They found lots of minibeasts, including examples of annelids, molluscs, insects, and arachnids. The pupils then recorded their findings whilst remaining respectful of the habitats of the creatures.



Science Club

Science Club is always very popular and the pupils have got off to a great start this term with a series of experiments. Here is some of what they have been investigating:

Lesson title: Science is all around

The children moved around a carousel of activities

1. The Washing up liquid boat experiment

They found out about the surface tension of water by disturbing it with washing up liquid to propel a paper boat.

2. Cloud in a jar experiment

The pupils created a cloud in a jar using warm water, ice and hairspray.

3. The Mystery of the twirling tin foil experiment

They explored how heat rises by lighting candles to help a foil spiral spin around.



4. The Rising Water experiment

The children lowered a glass over water and matches on a cork. They observed that, as the matches burned up all of the oxygen, the molecules moved more quickly and many of them escaped making the air less




dense causing the water to rise.

Lesson title: 2D and 3D bubble wands

The children were posed the question, are bubbles always spherical?

They then used pipe cleaners and straws to make 2D and 3D bubble wands which proved that bubbles take the form of the shape they are in.



Lesson title: Liquid Density bottles

The pupils were asked if liquids are all the same. Then, they made bottles half filled with water and food colouring, and half filled with oil and oil-based colouring. They were able to observe that oil and water don't mix as they have different densities and even when shaken to create a new colour, they will re-settle back to their original state (water at the bottom, oil on top).





Pre-Prep Ancient Egyptian Day

The Year 1 & 2 children were immersed into the fascinating world of Ancient Egypt with a workshop run by Divergent Drama. Thank you to all the parents who provided such amazing costumes to make the session come alive for the pupils.
















Haruya - Piano Success
