### **Remembrance Service**

This annual event reminds us of the huge sacrifice many made for our country. Our Head, Mr Belsito spoke of the importance of our school virtues when reflecting on the meaning of 'Remembrance' including, Justice, Fortitude and most importantly Love.

For example, Ancient Greek artists would use pottery to convey the stories of their gods and goddesses. After lunch, the children had the chance to explore some of the exhibits and searched for the artefacts that they had been learning about.




## **Nursery & Reception Nativity Play**
